Health T Level

- The Health T Level is a new course that will allow you to experience substantial work experience in the industry and allow you to progress on to university, employment or an apprenticeship in a clinical setting.
- We offer the Health T Level with a choice of three occupational specialisms in the second year: adult nursing, mental health nursing and therapies. This two-year programme is equivalent to three A levels and will allow you to experience a minimum of 45 days on a clinical or healthcare placement.

Health T Level

- We offer three pathways, including: nursing, occupational therapy or mental health nursing – these have been selected already.
- After the winter holidays, we will start putting the industry placements on the job board. Interested learners can then apply and will be required to be interviewed.
- To prepare you for a clinical placement, we will be completing the care certificate after the exams in June. This has been requested by our partner employers.

Health T Level

- We have been working collaboratively behind the scenes and as a citywide venture to support students' industry placements:
- We have partnered with employers from Leeds Teaching Hospital, Leeds City Council , Leeds and York Trust and private organisations to enable the T Level learners to access bespoke clinical placements. You will hear from some of those professionals this evening.

What can you do to prepare for industry placement?

- Placements start in September 2022 on Wednesdays and Thursdays
- Apply for industry placements posted on the job board
- Ensure that you attend and notify your college and employers of any absence
- Wear your uniform with pride. Do not wear jewellery, nails are a big no and hair must be tidy
- Complete your Disclosure and Barring Service
- Be fully vaccinated in line with the Department of Health guidelines
- To pass the full two-year course, you must complete an industry placement to the minimum requirement



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
