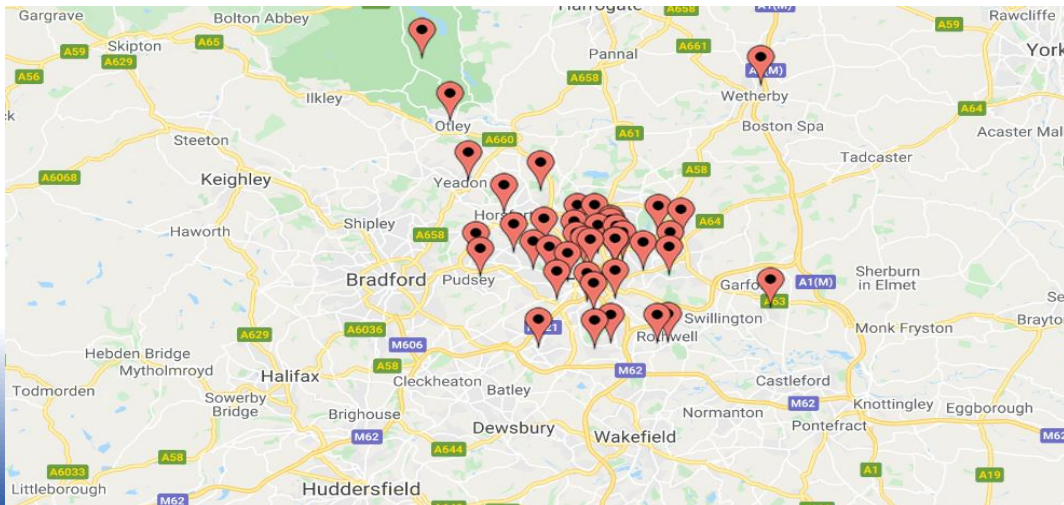

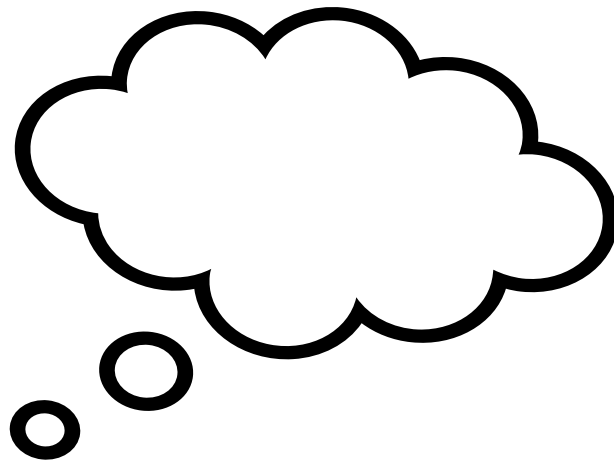
What can we offer?

Neighbourhood teams

Your neighbourhood teams are a local community-based team made up of community matrons, nurses, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, clinical assistants and dedicated administration staff. We work with your GP, social workers, the hospital and local voluntary organisations to coordinate your care. The neighbourhood team works 7 am to 10 pm. We also have a night nursing service which operates 9.30 pm to – 7 am, seven days a week.

- Support when patients are acutely unwell but do not require hospital admission
- Support with long-term conditions that may affect daily life
- End-of-life and palliative care
- Rehabilitation
- Provide support, advice and education to help patients manage their own health conditions
